### **Tuggeranong Community Council ACT Budget ideas for 2018**

Dear Chief Minister

The Tuggeranong Community Council would like to submit the following ideas for the ACT 2018-19 budget. They are as following:

- Revitalise and better plan Tuggeranong Town Centre
  - Anketell Street
  - Laneway to Lake – planning and building

A study/project into how to activate the night time economy and 'eat' street precinct ideas set out in the Tuggeranong master plan 2012.

A master plan for the 'eat' street and allied precinct plan changes to facilitate development.

- Safety
  - Improved Lighting
    - Behind Tuggeranong CIT,
    - Tuggeranong Bus interchange and bus stops in general
    - Underpasses around the area for safety reasons review and improve safety
    - Paths around lake - appropriate size for both pedestrians and cyclists
- Transport and Infrastructure
  - Re-routing buses from in front of Tuggeranong Hyperdome in Anketell Street
  - Upgrade to Tuggeranong Bus Interchange
  - Better integrated transport strategy for all methods of transport including Improvements to bus services (particularly in Tuggeranong)
  - Better bus app
  - Improvements to car parking and road infrastructure at the Sulwood Drive access to Mt Taylor
- Waste
  - Expands green waste collection throughout the ACT
  - Look at organic waste collection



- Environment
  - Funding to community based Catchment groups
- Community Arts and Sport
  - Trial public art installations in the laneway and town centre in conjunction with Tuggeranong arts centre
  - Gateway /public art installation /welcoming signage to the town centre that utilise the Soward Way bridge
  - A graffiti art intervention project for Lanyon local centre
  - Improvements to the streetscape on corner of Jim Pike and along Woodcock Drive to address tagging
  - Deliver on election commitment to improve rowing club facilities
- Gaps in community services:

There continues to be a big gap in services for vulnerable families in the Tuggeranong region. Tuggeranong is underserved in terms of family casework and parenting education, particularly in comparison to the Belconnen region. Specifically, there is an identified gap in services for young people aged 8-12 years and their families.
